Requirements Regarding Investigation

In-house employees conducting investigations (e.g., HR professional, manager, etc.) must be qualified, experienced, and professionally trained in investigatory processes in order to meet California Fair Employment and Housing Act (FEHA) requirements to investigate complaints of harassment, discrimination and retaliation, and prevent and promptly correct any problematic behavior.

Not only is this a legal requirement, but investigations can go a long way in mitigating risks and protecting from liability.
